WHY MARATHON

The work of Marathon Scholars has never been more vital or relevant. Research continues to show unequivocally that more jobs in the future will require a post secondary education and that individuals with a postsecondary degree are significantly more likely to earn more over their lifetimes, be healthier, be less likely to need government assistance and be more engaged citizens. **Education continues to be the very strongest force to break the cycle of generational poverty.** It has become crystal clear that the only way to increase our nation's college attainment rates—and a healthy economy demands that we do—is to address the reality that college access and completion are dramatically lower for economically disadvantaged students and those from underrepresented populations. These students are not less deserving, less capable, less intelligent or less motivated. But they are less able to connect the resources, knowledge and inspiration to access the higher education options many of their peers take for granted. That's where Marathon comes in. We find it completely unacceptable that nationwide, only 10% of low-income students will achieve a 4-year degree. Marathon connects with kids early, in the 4th grade, to get them on the path to success. Marathon Scholars know from the start that over the next 12 years, they will have access to:

- College awareness and enrichment activities
- One-on-one support of a caring Marathon Partner to mentor them
- A \$12,000 scholarship waiting for them when they get to college!

The Marathon program is helping kids in our community beat the odds.



COLLEGE VISITS GIVE SCHOLARS VISION

If no one in your family has ever been to college and your peer group doesn't prioritize higher education, it can be really hard to visualize how going to college might truly look and feel—and how it can change your life! In 2013 Marathon Scholars got the chance to see their possible future with visits to local colleges every other month! Thanks to a generous grant from the Windemere Foundation every Scholar had the opportunity to visit a college. Nearly every Scholar signed up for at least one visit and Scholars in 5th grade all the way to High School seniors attended. Marathon Scholars visited Pacific University, University of Portland, University of Oregon, Linfield, Lewis & Clark, and Portland State University. Research has shown that even stepping foot on a college campus can increase the odds of a child attending. If the excitement and reactions of our Scholars are any indication, we are seeing that research in action.

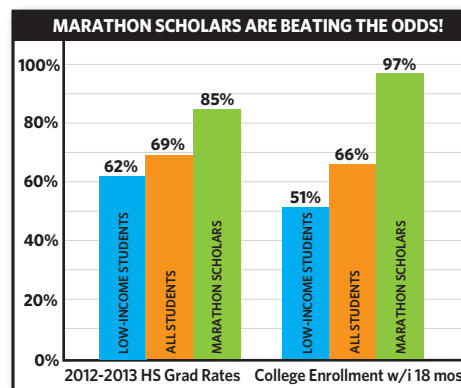

In 2013, we were exceptionally proud to report that, once again, our Scholars are headed to college at a rate far higher than their peers! Scholars in 2013 enrolled at the University of Oregon, Portland State University, the University of Washington, Western Oregon University and Clark College. These Scholars join the 30 college aged Scholars attending colleges and universities across the country! Marathon also continued to award scholarships to Scholars. In 2013, Marathon Scholars received over \$50,000 in college scholarships!

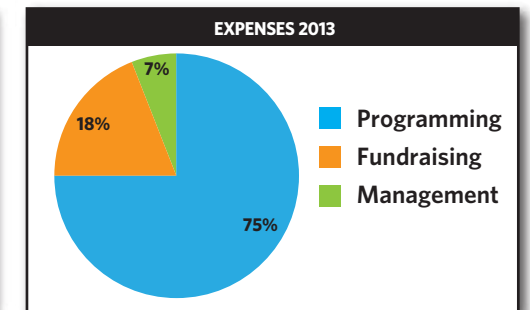
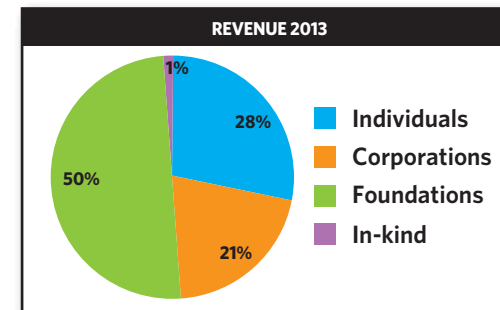
